The Earned Income Tax Credit

The EITC is a refundable federal tax credit that helps working people achieve economic stability and security.

The Advance Earned Income Tax Credit

A refundable credit for certain qualified workers. It is intended to help offset some of the increases in living expenses and Social Security taxes. This credit reduces the amount of tax owed, if any, and may result in a refund to the taxpayer. An eligible employee who wants the credit with his or her pay must give you (the employer) a completed and signed Form W-5.

State Earned Income Tax credit

If you qualify to claim EITC on your federal income tax return, you also may be eligible for a similar credit on your state or local income tax return. Twenty-two states, including Michigan, offer their residents an earned income tax credit. When completing your Federal 1040, if you are eligible for the EITC, the State form will be included when you file your Federal tax return.

Child and Dependant Care Credit

If you paid someone to care for a child or a dependent so you could work, you may be able to reduce your federal income tax by claiming the Credit for Child and Dependent Care expenses on your tax return. This Credit is available to people who, in order to work or to look for work, have to pay for child care services for dependents under age 13. The Credit is also available if you paid for the care of a spouse or a dependent of any age who is physically or mentally incapable of self-care.

Child Tax Credit

This credit is for people who have a qualifying child. It is in addition to the credit for child and dependent care and the earned income credit. To be eligible you have to file a federal 1040.

Additional Child Tax Credit

This credit is for certain individuals that get less than the full amount of the child tax credit. The additional child tax credit may give you a refund even if you do not owe any tax.
